- Fri., March 5: Re-read Luke 18, 19

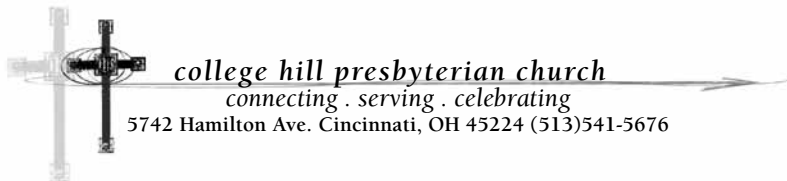
